When originally asked by her son, Highland Park Village co-owner Stephen Summers, to open a pop-up, Summers says she couldn't resist the opportunity to create a permanent space for new clients and established



fans alike. "The change of direction into retail always put me at bay because I'm so busy, but it was too good to pass up. None of these people were represented in Dallas."

Crown Jewels If there is one thing royals have in spades it's one-of-a-kind jewelry. **Mikimoto**, the world's premier purveyor of pearls, looked to pieces created for lady sovereigns, past and present, for its latest line, The Regalia Collection—a most worthy successor to the throne. After all, Kokichi Mikimoto himself was known as the King of Pearls for his ability to create handcrafted masterpieces for noble women throughout the world. His legacy endures with these exquisite tassels (one of nine pieces in the collection), which feature 14 of the rarest cascading, baroque golden pearls excavated from the Pacific South Sea. The earrings also boast 60 stunning diamonds set in 18K white gold, making them truly imperial. —JZG
