That's why Brook Hollow Golf Club turned to the design firm for the interior architecture and design of its \$19 million tennis/fitness building, pro shop and exterior venue. "The interior design is reminiscent of a summer home in The Hamptons," Meredith says. The result of the 2 1/2-year process is a "progression of intimate spaces" that utilize a light and airy color palette accented by reclaimed wood flooring and bronze interior windows and transoms. The fitness facility overlooks the golf course and pool terraces, visually bringing the outside in. There has been much ado about everything in renowned interior designer **Emily Summers' Studio 54** retail boutique since she opened it in Highland Park Village in late 2014—the hubbub hasn't hushed since. Summers keeps it fresh with her namesake furnishings collection and locally created, vintage or new furnishings, rugs, lighting and accessories. The most recent news: She's now the exclusive North American dealer for the T.H. Robsjohn-Gibbins furniture collection for Saridis of Athens, bringing the iconic Klismos line stateside for the first time in four decades. The pieces are the result of a 1960s collaboration between Robsjohn-Gibbins and cabinetmakers Susan and Eleftherios Saridis, and each was crafted with walnut, leather and bronze—the same materials Greek artisans employed thousands of years ago.
